<b>First-Year Writing:</b> Complete English (ENGL) 110, Introduction to Academic Writing, or one of the approved course credit combinations satisfying the first-year writing general education requirement.		<b>Math/Logic:</b> Complete 6 credit hours from the list of approved courses satisfying the math or logic general education requirement.	
<b>Foreign Language:</b> Complete the 202-level or its equivalent or demonstrate proficiency at that level of an approved course satisfying the foreign language general education requirement.		<b>Natural Science:</b> Complete 8 credit hours of an introductory or higher sequence (of which 2 credit hours must be earned in the accompanying laboratories) from the list of approved course sequences satisfying the natural science general education requirement.	
<b>History:</b> Complete one course in pre-modern history and one course in modern history from the list of approved courses satisfying the history general education requirement (6 credit hours). The two courses do not have to be taken from the same department or in sequence.		<b>Social Sciences:</b> Complete 6 credit hours from the list of approved courses satisfying the social science general education requirement.

### Second Year Notes

**Note 1:** To take education (EDFS) courses beyond EDFS 303, you must be fully admitted to the teacher education program. This requires:

- Grade of C or better in EDFS 201.
- Overall GPA of 2.75
- Passing scores on the three components of the PRAXIS Core OR qualifying SAT or ACT scores. If a student does not have a qualifying SAT or ACT score he/she must take the PRAXIS Core in reading, writing, and mathematics. It is also listed on ETS' website as the Core Academic Skills for Educators. The test code for the combined test (reading, writing, and mathematics) is 5751.
- You must submit the required dispositions forms. They are located at (<http://ehhp.cofc.edu/novice>)

**Note 2:** To continue in the teacher education program, you must maintain an overall GPA at or above 2.75, subject matter GPA must be at or above 2.5 and Education GPA is required to remain at or above 3.0. If the overall GPA is below 2.75, the subject matter GPA is below 2.5 or the GPA in education is lower than 3.0 a student will need to contact the Associate Department Chair in Teacher Education to discuss options.
