<b>Min. Grade:</b>	Lists if the major has a minimum grade requirement for this course.		
<b>Critical:</b>	TIME = Timing. This course must be completed in the semester listed to ensure a timely graduation.		
<b>GenEd</b>	Indicates whether or not this major course can also fulfill a general education requirement.

<b>First-Year Writing:</b> Complete English (ENGL) 110, Introduction to Academic Writing, or one of the approved course credit combinations satisfying the first-year writing general education requirement.		<b>Math/Logic:</b> Complete 6 credit hours from the list of approved courses satisfying the math or logic general education requirement.	
<b>Foreign Language:</b> Complete the 202-level or its equivalent or demonstrate proficiency at that level of an approved course satisfying the foreign language general education requirement.		<b>Natural Science:</b> Complete 8 credit hours of an introductory or higher sequence (of which 2 credit hours must be earned in the accompanying laboratories) from the list of approved course sequences satisfying the natural science general education requirement.	
<b>History:</b> Complete one course in pre-modern history and one course in modern history from the list of approved courses satisfying the history general education requirement (6 credit hours). The two courses do not have to be taken from the same department or in sequence.		<b>Social Sciences:</b> Complete 6 credit hours from the list of approved courses satisfying the social science general education requirement.

<p>Note 1: The General Education First-Year Writing requirement should be completed within the first or second semester.</p> <p>Note 2: First-Year Experience Requirement: All entering students with less than one year of college experience are required to complete a <a href="#">First-Year Experience</a> (First-Year Seminar (FYSM), a Learning Community (LC), or an Honors College First-Year Experience course) within their first three consecutive academic terms.</p> <p>Note 3: If you have been awarded Advanced Placement (AP), International Baccalaureate (IB) or Transfer (TR) English credit, please use the following guidelines when choosing your general education English course(s):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Students with credit for English 101 &amp; 102 (6 credit hours) satisfy the general education requirement for English.</li> <li>• Students with English 101 credit (3 credit hours) must complete English 110 (4 credit hours) or 215 (3 credit hours).</li> <li>• Students with English 102 credit (3 credit hours) must complete English 110 (4 credit hours) or 215 (3 credit hours).</li> </ul> <p>Note 4: Students who complete ENGL 110 in Semester One may begin taking courses for the major (ideally ENGL 201, 202, or 207) in Semester Two.</p>

### Second Year Notes

Note 1: Ideally, students will take ENGL 201 before ENGL 202, or take them simultaneously. For English Majors, ENGL 201, 202, and 207 are pre-requisites for all 300+ level English courses.

Note 2: ENGL 299 may also be taken in the second year; it should be taken as students transition from the 200-level surveys (201, 202, 207) to 300-level coursework.

Note 3: ENGL 220 or ENGL 223 may also be taken in the second year.

### Third Year Notes

Note 1: Creative writing concentrators must take four 300+ level English courses that are not in creative writing; they are chosen from courses that meet specific requirements for the major. See your advisor (!) and consult the undergraduate catalog, advising worksheets, and Degree Works for more detailed information.

Note 2: Consider studying abroad during your Junior year. Many programs offer courses that will transfer in as 300+ level English courses. See the Associate Chair of English if you plan to study abroad this year or any year.

Note 3: Consider pursuing an internship your Junior or Senior year. ENGL 495 is an online practicum for students working at internships; it counts as one of your two electives in the major.
