General Education Requirement

First-Year Writing: Complete English (ENGL) 110, Introduction to Academic Writing, or one of the approved course credit combinations satisfying the first-year writing general education requirement.	Math/Logic: Completion of MATH 120 or HONS 115 or transfer credit for any one of MATH 220, MATH 221, MATH 323 (any of which requires the comprehension of the content of MATH 120/HONS 115); or 6 credit hours from the remaining list of approved courses satisfying the math/logic general education requirement.
Foreign Language: Complete the 202-level or its equivalent or demonstrate proficiency at that level of an approved course satisfying the foreign language general education requirement.	Natural Science: Complete 8 credit hours of an introductory or higher sequence (of which 2 credit hours must be earned in the accompanying laboratories) from the list of approved course sequences satisfying the natural science general education requirement.
History: Complete one course in pre-modern history and one course in modern history from the list of approved courses satisfying the history general education requirement (6 credit hours). The two courses do not have to be taken from the same department or in sequence.	Social Sciences: Complete 6 credit hours from the list of approved courses satisfying the social science general education requirement.
Humanities: Complete 12 credit hours from the list of approved courses satisfying the humanities general education requirement with no more than 6 credit hours with the same acronym. Note 1: The General Education First-Year Writing requirement should be completed within the first or second semester.

Note 2: General Education First-Year Experience Requirement: All entering students with less than one year of college experience are required to complete a [First-Year Experience](#) (First-Year Seminar (FYSM), a Learning Community (LC), or an Honors College First-Year Experience course) within their first three consecutive academic terms.

Note 3: The Classics BA requires majors to take CLAS 101 and CLAS 102 or CLAS 103 and CLAS 105. There are no prerequisites for these courses. Courses in ancient history taught with HIST designations (HIST 231 and 232) require fulfillment of the history GenEd requirements. It is therefore recommended to complete this GenEd requirement in the first year.

Note 2: BA Classics majors are strongly advised to include a minor (or second major) that complements the work conducted in the major. This could take the form of traditionally-viewed cognate areas (archaeology, political science, history, English) or more iconoclastic areas of study (computer science, environmental studies, business administration).
